

The Court, determining that judicial efficiency would be better served by having the Circuit Court Administrator's Office serve as the assigned judge clerk in order to centralize all such functions;

IT IS ORDERED:

1. The Circuit Court Administrator, or his designee, shall serve as assigned judge clerk.
2. The Circuit Court Clerk, upon entry of an order disqualifying all 37th Judicial Circuit Court Judges; or, upon entry of an order in which all four (4) Circuit Judges have become disqualified, shall send a copy of the disqualification order or orders immediately to the Circuit Court Administrator for the purpose of the Circuit Court Administrator filing a request with the State Court Administrator for appointment of an assigned judge for the matter.
3. The assigned judge clerk shall also be responsible for cases in which the State Court Administrator is requesting that a 37th Circuit Judge serve as an assigned judge for another court. The Court Administrator, for this purpose, shall maintain a roster in order to assure that out-of-circuit assignments are distributed proportionately among the four (4) judges.
4. The Circuit Court Administrator is authorized to execute requests for assigned judges filed with the State Court Administrator on behalf of the Chief Judge pursuant to court rule.
5. This Order shall become effective December 1, 1993.
