**Re: Enbridge Line 6B Phase II Replacement Project
Landowners – Notice of Permit Issuance and Start of Construction**

Dear Ms. Scott:

This letter is to notify you that on January 31, 2013, the Michigan Public Service Commission (MPSC) approved Enbridge Energy, Limited Partnership's application to replace the remaining segments of its Line 6B crude oil pipeline in the state of Michigan. This approval authorizes Enbridge to construct the 36-inch diameter crude oil replacement pipeline in the areas of Berrien, Cass, St. Joseph, Kalamazoo, Calhoun, Jackson and Ingham counties, along with the 30-inch diameter crude oil replacement pipeline in the areas of Oakland, Macomb and St. Clair counties under the company's Line 6B Phase II Replacement Project. We want to make you aware that initial construction activities have started in some areas and will continue throughout fall 2013. The first step is staking the pipeline "footprint" to outline the area to be used by the contractor.

Construction

The contractor, Precision Pipeline LLC, will commence clearing and grading activities on various parcels. Stringing the pipe, welding and trenching activities will follow. Construction activities will occur at different times in the various segments over the coming months, and we plan to complete construction of the Line 6B Phase II Replacement Project by the end of this year. As we get closer to specific properties, land agents assigned to each area will be in contact with land owners with more information regarding construction schedule. Dear Landowners and Public Officials:

Construction on the project referred to as the Line 6B - Phase 2 Replacement begins in earnest the second week of July in Michigan. Work in Indiana is expected to begin later this summer.

In Michigan, one crew of about 600 workers starts in Stockbridge and moves west, while another crew of 600 workers start in Mendon and moves west. These two crews, hired primarily by our contractor Precision Pipeline, of Eau Claire, Wis., are comprised of about 60 percent specialized pipeline workers and 40 percent hired from local union halls.

The temporary construction operations for these crews are located in Jackson, Mich. and in the Niles/Southbend area. While workers will do business along the entire construction route, the greatest concentration and impact will likely be in and around those communities where workers have found temporary housing and will need associated living services from laundry to dining.

Residents, businesses and local officials can expect workers spending their paychecks locally for goods and services. You can also expect increased traffic with heavy equipment and pipe being hauled to the right-of-way construction sites. Please watch for construction flaggers on the roads we cross as work moves from site to site.

Teams of specialized crews work in an assembly line manner to complete the various tasks of the replacement project. Crews will begin work early each day and generally continue during daylight hours. There may be isolated situations where work is required to continue after dark. With construction activity increasing, for your safety and that of others, please do not enter work areas. Tampering with Enbridge and our contractors' property is considered trespassing.

As the new pipeline segments are completed they are filled with water and pressure tested. Coating surveys are conducted to verify the integrity of the pipe's coating and tools are run inside the new pipe to verify the safety and quality of the new pipeline. Any issues discovered during these material and construction quality checks are addressed prior to the line being commissioned and placed in service. Construction of the replacement project is expected to be completed by the end of this year.

With the exception of a segment of pipe between Howell and Ortonville Michigan, the Line 79 and Line 6B 2012 projects are completed. This last segment is expected to be placed in service during July and the right-of-way restoration will continue.

CONSTRUCTION DOLLARS EXTEND AND EXPAND IN MICHIGAN AS PIPELINERS BEGIN THEIR WORK

This summer's project is bringing in additional temporary construction workers to Michigan as well as drawing from local union halls for local workers. Construction workers will be in Indiana when construction begins there later this summer. All will need goods and services provided by businesses located along the pipeline construction route.


With an anticipated six-month construction schedule, local merchants from restaurants to clothing shops, hotels, barber shops, laundromats, gas stations, car dealerships, and others will see an economic boon estimated at \$330,000 a week along the route.

Consider this: Average fuel consumed weekly from local suppliers is \$250,000. Other than fuel, the contractor is anticipated to spend up to \$665,000 a week on consumables related to the project.

Following construction, workers will move on to their next project or return home. But, Enbridge will remain here operating the new pipeline with employees located in Indiana and Michigan.

MACOMB: Phase 2 Replacement construction to begin late Summer 2013.

ST CLAIR: Phase 2 Replacement construction to begin late Summer 2013.

Did you know...

Construction expenses include the purchase of local services such as security, temporary utility hook-ups, portable toilets and the like. These types of purchases are predicted to total about \$210,000 per week for the estimated six month construction schedule.
